
Japanese Language Education Division, GlobE (Center for Japanese Language Education) 2024S Semester Application Guidelines



*Center for Japanese Language Education is a common name for Japanese Language Education Department, Center for Global Education, UTokyo

Course Eligibility

The Japanese language courses of the Center are open to those who are affiliated with the UTokyo as follows:

① International students, ②Foreign researchers, and ③Their (①,②) spouses (*Some classes only).

<u>Non-UTokyo members are not eligible to take the courses</u>. Every course has different eligibility requirements, so please make sure to check in advance.

Online Registration

The application documents are submitted through Online Application System, available at the Center's website.

[Step 1: System registration]

- * For those who have already completed system registration, please move to Step 2.

 - (1) A copy of Official Student ID/Staff ID card issued by UTokyo
 - (2) Your <u>ID photo</u> (4cm x 3cm)
 - (3) A statement testifying that the applicant is a spouse of the university's student or researcher (<u>refer to the template</u>)

[Step 2: Application for Japanese courses this semester]

- * You are required to upload a copy of your UTokyo ID every semester even if you have already completed system registration.
- •Please take the level check test on the Center's website, then select the appropriate course to apply. Depending on the course of your choice, you may be required to supply additional documents.
- For the deadlines to apply to each course, please refer to the course guideline. No applications will be accepted after the deadline.

NOTE

- Classes will be taught online.
- •No credits from UTokyo are granted in the courses offered by the Center for Japanese Language Education.
- •When necessary, the Center's faculty members will advise applicants to switch from the class they applied to another class/course which is more suitable for their interests, schedule, or level.
- After registering for the course, we will send you information about the course and important instructions via email until the day before the course begins. Information such as the Zoom URL and course materials can also be checked there.
- The course might be cancelled if enrollment is below the prescribed minimum.


Timetables

- *In the General Course, classes primarily focus on oral communication (speaking and listening). Among these, the 'Comprehensive Japanese' levels 1 to 4 (2 lessons per week) serve as the base for each level. Please choose and enroll in one level.
- *If there are available levels, you can also combine them with other optional subjects and take multiple courses. In the elementary stage, it is recommended to prioritize taking the foundational subjects for your better understanding, but it is also possible to enroll in optional courses only.
- *The Comprehensive Japanese courses at level 3 and below, Kanji 1, and Kanji 2 are open to spouses of international students and foreign researchers.






NOTE


NOTE

Short-term Japanese Course


